

I know from talking to people just how much they value the newsletter dropping through their letter boxes and I personally would like to express my thanks and gratitude to both Mike and John.

A458 Trunk Road - Property blight and Local Development Plan

I have now received a response from the Deputy First Minister Ieuan Wyn Jones, Minister for the Economy and Transport acknowledging the concerns I have raised with him over so called 'property blight' affecting many properties alongside the proposed by-pass routes identified in 2004. The Minister appears sympathetic to our cause and has indicated he will consider reviewing the situation. I have no intention of letting this matter drop and will continue to argue the case it is unfair for the proposals to remain in WAG's Trunk Road Forward Programme if there is no realistic chance of them succeeding and that the favourable option forward is for local achievable solutions in specific notorious black-spot areas.

Closing date Friday 6th May 2011

Many of you may be aware the County Council has commenced the preparation of the Local Development Plan (LDP) for Powys and is currently searching for potential development sites (known as Candidate Sites) for all purposes. As the LDP will help shape and guide development within Powys up to 2026, I am concerned whilst the trunk road improvement scheme continues to be ranked in WAG's Trunk Road Forward Programme of works there is the potential to prohibit successful Candidate site submissions in our community that are on, near or adjacent to identified routes, yet one more reason why the Minister must consider the impact the identified routes are having on our community.

With the strong focussed political drive to secure a Newtown by-pass and the public spending cuts announced as a result of the UK Governments Comprehensive Spending Review impacting on all Capital Road programmes, common sense suggests a by-pass for the villages of Middletown and Trewern is now extremely doubtful and whilst it may remain an aspiration, it must be questioned whether the local property market and future development plans for our community should continue to be put on hold indefinitely in order to protect identified routes.
